To qualify for the list, companies must have their headquarters in the Atlanta metro area (subsidiaries of other companies are not included), and they must have 2006 revenue between \$1 million and \$300 million. They must have a two-year growth in sales of more than 50 percent. Companies are ranked by a growth index formula, which is used to level the playing field among companies of different sizes.

Factors in the formula include the percent change and absolute change in revenue and number of employees from 2004 through 2006. The results are ranked against those of all companies on the list. Employee growth was weighted 40 percent and revenue growth was weighted 60 percent.
